

Harvest Mouse Micromys minutus

Species Action Plan



Harvest mice Micromys minutus are the smallest of our British rodents, with a weight of around 6g. They have a semi-prehensile tail, which they use to assist climbing in vegetation, and are the only species of mouse in the UK to build a woven nest above ground. In the summer months they build spherical nests, sometimes as small as 5cm across, in rough grass and reed beds 10-100cm above ground depending on the habitat. During the winter months they adopt a more terrestrial lifestyle when nests are built on the ground. They can have up to three litters in a year, with an average of four to five young per litter.

Herefordshire is at the north western limits of its distribution in the UK. Its national status is unknown but believed to be in decline. Known sites which were resurveyed between 1970-1975 and 1996-1997 showed a decline of 71% (Sargent et al 1997). The status in Herefordshire is very uncertain due to lack of records and survey effort.

The harvest mouse has no specific legislative protection but is listed as a species of principle importance under the NERC Act (2006) and was added to the UK BAP in 2007.

Threats

- Fragmentation and loss of habitat
- Agricultural intensification
- Inappropriate management and loss of field margins
- · Inappropriate management of roadside verges
- · Reduction in number of field margins due to increased field size
- · Loss of food plants from herbicide use
- Loss of invertebrate food source due to insecticide use
- · Predation by domestic cat
